FIFTH ANNUAL MEETING OF THE MIDWESTERN PSYCHOLOGICAL ASSOCIATION

The Fifth Annual Meeting of the Midwestern Psychological Association will be held at Antioch College, Yellow Springs, Ohio, May 23-24, 1930. All the sessions will convene in the new Science Building on the south side of the campus. Everyone attending the meeting is asked to register immediately upon arrival.

Yellow Springs is reached by electric car in thirty minutes from Springfield or Xenia, which are on the main lines of the Big Four and Pennsylvania Railroads respectively. From the northwest the best connection is made by a through train on the Pennsylvania which leaves Chicago at 11:20 P. M. (berths ready for occupancy after 10:30 P. M.) and arrives in Yellow Springs at 8:30 A. M. Persons staying at hotels in Springfield may check their baggage through by buying tickets to Springfield (without extra fare).

For those driving, the village of Yellow Springs is on Ohio Route 53, halfway between Xenia and Springfield.

Reservations should be made directly with the hotels.

Antioch College will provide autobus transportation to Springfield after the Friday and Saturday evening meetings and from Springfield before the Saturday morning meeting. There is also interurban connection for those who do not drive. Free parking space overnight will be available near the hotels.

A limited number of rooms may be obtained in private homes in Yellow Springs and in the men's dormitories. Accommodations in the latter are of course not those of a first class hotel; the charge will be \$1.00 a night in the dormitories, and \$1.50 and \$2.00 in private homes.

The annual dinner will be served in the college dining room. As only two hundred persons can be served, tickets must be purchased in advance. Price \$1.00. (Informal dress.)

Meals will be served in the college dining room, in the tea room maintained by the college adjacent to the campus, and at *The Maples*, a small tea room in the village.

Rest room facilities for women will be provided in the women's dormitory. The parlors in the women's dormitory will be open at all times to attendants of the meeting.

It will greatly facilitate the work of the local committee in making arrangements for the meeting if those expecting to attend will fill out the following blank and return it at once to the Secretary (H. B. English, Antioch College, Yellow Springs, Ohio). Programs will be sent only to those who indicate their intention of attending the meeting.
